1<sup>ST</sup> DAY: on Wednesday afternoon, <u>April 18th, 2012</u>
"From the art collections of aristocratic family owners to the creation of House
<u>Museums: a general perspective"</u>

Contributions related to this subject will aim to provide a historical survey on the various types of existing house museums, concentrating the attention on house museums originated in buildings owned by noble families in which art collections built up by random accumulation through the centuries or by the collecting activities of particular family members, are displayed. The period examined will range from the sixteenth to the nineteenth century.

After the greetings of the Authorities and by **prof. Ruggero Ranieri** (President, Uguccione Ranieri di Sorbello Foundation), **Prof. Rosanna Pavoni** (ex President, Demhist) will open the session introducing the different typologies of House Museums in Italy and the rest of the world. **Dr Helen Rees Leahy** (director of the Center of Museology, University of Manchester) will close the day with a contribution about the identity of house museums.

Other speakers will be: **Prof. Francesco Federico Mancini** (University of Perugia), **Dr. Gianluca Kannes** (Settore Musei e Patrimonio Culturale, Regione Piemonte), **Prof. Stefano Papetti** (University of Camerino), **Prof. Arch. Federica Arman** (University of Parma), **Dr. Hetty Berens** (curator from the Netherlands Architecture Institute of Rotterdam; curator of the Sonneveld House Museum).

## 2nd DAY: Thursday, <u>April 19th, 2012</u> "House museums and house owners: from private to public"

- issues relating to the significance and meaning of the collections;
- the solutions adopted in displaying the collections;
- the evolution of past and present in house museums through the change of generations;
- accessing the significants of the family archives and libraries within house museums.
